#### **Greetings to you in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ**

This month, I have asked my wife Liz to share something with you. I hope you like what she has to say and will be willing to accept her challenge.

The other day I was watching a video message from our New Wine Local Regional Director and something he said has really resonated with me. He said we should not be practicing 'social distancing'.

Don't panic, he did not mean that we should be getting close to each other and ignoring the guidelines. It is important that we follow the Covid-19 rules and keep 2 metres from those we do not live or bubble with to protect us and them from the virus.

What he was suggesting was that we should be 'physically distant' from one another, not 'socially distant'.

We need to stay **Physically Distanced** and **Socially Connected**.

As the days get colder and the nights darker it is going to get harder for us all living under the restrictions, which could get tighter as cases grow. At a time when so many in our communities are already feeling isolated, alone and scared of what the next few months will bring it is vital that we make the effect to stay connected with them and each other. I am challenging all of us (me included) to:

- 1. Choose six people and make a point of contacting them regularly. You may want to phone or video call them each week or suggest going on a physically distanced walk together or meet up over zoom to play a game.
- 2. Choose six people and pray for them each week. Pray that they will know the love of Jesus and feel him close to them.

Let us make sure that whilst we are maintaining physical distance from each other we are staying socially connected.

Jesus said, "A new command I give you: Love one another. As I have loved you, so you must love one another. By this everyone will know that you are my disciples, if you love one another." *John 13: 34-35*

With the launch of the NHS Covid-19 app, you will now be able to check-in using the app and the QR codes at church. If you don't have access to a compatible smartphone and the app, you are still welcome to attend, but you will need to fill in a NHS Test & Trace form for each visit.

The numbers attending Church will continue to be limited, but as we haven't hit maximum capacity yet we no longer think there's any need to be telling us in advance if you wish to come. Hopefully there will always be enough room for all those who would like to attend. Although this may change in the future.

For your safety and the safety of others, face coverings must be worn by all who are not exempt from doing so. Please be prepared to queue outside the Church until you are shown to a seat (which may not be your usual one). Strict social distancing between households/support bubbles will be in place. And as much as we would want to greet one another with a handshake, warm hug or a kiss, that won't be possible either. Please follow the one way system in Church and make use of the hand sanitiser at the entrance and exit of the Church. We are still prohibited from singing hymns during our worship and we are also required to keep the church doors open throughout the services so you might want to dress appropriately. Sadly, refreshments are not permitted to be served after our services so you'll have to wait till you get home for your coffee.

While we are delighted to be resuming some of our worship in our Church building, we are aware that there are a good many people who, for one reason or another, do not yet feel comfortable about returning to gathered worship.
