Not Everything is Better Online

Many things that used to take time to achieve can now be accomplished online in a fraction of the time. For example, I recently applied to renew my Passport. The process was



incredibly simple, completed with a photo taken on my mobile phone. There was no need to queue at the post office to get the correct form, no need to talk to anyone, no need to wait for the photo-booth to process and print my photo, no need to find someone to countersign the photo, no need to get the form double checked at the post office. It was, in short, a very simple process.

Even the art of letter writing has taken on new levels with the introduction of AI (artificial intelligence) ChatBots. Have you ever wondered what this letter might look like if produced by a ChatBot? Well, apparently, something like this:

(As we approach the month of April, we are reminded of the significance of this time in the Christian calendar. April is the month of Easter, and it culminates with the celebration of Resurrection Sunday on April 16th. We are excited to celebrate the hope and promise of new life that this day represents. We invite you to join us for our special Resurrection Sunday service on April 16th at (time). We will have a powerful message of hope and joy, as we celebrate the resurrection of our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ.)

It begins so well, but then it is obvious that the ChatBox can't distinguish between our date of Easter and that of the Orthodox Church; and it doesn't spell in an English way. Those are minor details, but more importantly it seems to be lacking warmth and connection. You'll probably be pleased to know that I won't be resorting to ChatBox to write my personal message to you each month.

As a Church, we are a gathered people. Yes, it is possible to watch a Church service online - and we certainly did our fair chunk of that during the Covid lockdown - but it is still not the same being present with others as we worship the living God. In Church we sit, stand, kneel, recite our responses,



HOLV WEEK AT ST LEONARD'S

Holy Week this year is the period from Sunday 2nd April to Sunday 9th April and the following is a brief explanation about all the services we shall be holding.

Unlike fixed celebrations like Christmas and Halloween, Easter is considered a "moveable feast" and can fall anywhere between March 22nd and April 25th - this year it will fall roughly between the two dates.

Easter is celebrated on the first Sunday after the full moon, officially called "Paschal Moon", that comes on or just after the Spring Equinox of March 21st. This year the first full moon after the Spring Equinox takes place on Thursday April 6th which means that Easter Day will fall on the following Sunday, April 9th,. Should the first full moon ever fall on a Sunday, Easter is celebrated on the following Sunday.



2nd April - Palm Sunday Service at 9.30am

Palm Palm Sunday marks the beginning of Holy Week and com-Sunday memorates the triumphant entry of Jesus into Jerusalem riding as the "Prince of Peace" on a donkey, an animal

symbolising peace, with crowds waving and laying down palm branches before Him, themselves a symbol of honour, triumph and victory. At our service everyone receives a small cross which is made of palm leaves.



6th April - Maundy Thursday Service at 4pm

Maundy Thursday refers to the day on which the Last Supper Thursday took place. The word *maundy* comes from the Latin word mandatum meaning command from which we get our

English word mandate. That night Jesus said "I give you a new command: love one another. As I have loved you, so you are to love one another."

During the Last Supper Jesus washed the feet of his twelve disciples and Christians have come to interpret the symbolism of this act as an illustration of a humble mission of service, the cleansing of sin and the showing of forgiveness for us all. It is what Jesus calls us all to do, "small things with great love in service to one another."

The service in church concludes with the removal of all hangings and crosses from the altar so that it remains bare until Easter Day.



7th April - Good Friday Service at 10am

Good Friday can also be known as Holy Friday or Black Friday. It is the day when Jesus was crucified for our sins and some countries observe it with re-enactments of the procession carrying the cross. Even though Jesus was crucified on this

day, many Christians believe there is something good about Good Friday because it is the anniversary of Jesus' dying for our sins and if that had not happened, there would be no day of resurrection.

Good Friday is the fulfilment of God's salvation plan for us. At 3 o'clock in the afternoon Jesus willingly surrendered and endured all sufferings in order to accomplish God's plan to save us from our sins and death.

Mellia, 9th April - Easter Sunday Service at 9.30am



Easter is the most important festival in the Christian calendar. It is a day which symbolises the hope and joy of new life in the celebration of Jesus rising from the dead and so offering us all the promise of eternal life.

We really hope that you will be able to come to St Leonard's Church at some time during Holy Week to share our services either for quiet contemplation, reflection or celebration. You will be warmly welcomed.
