Long live the king!

The coronation of King Charles III on Saturday 6th May will be a unique occasion. We have never had

such a long time between the successive coronations of a British monarch. What will make this event unique is the fact that most of those taking part in the proceedings were not alive when the last one took place. Memories of those who were witnesses to our late Queen's coronation have begun to fade and the details are, perhaps, a little short on the actual details.

And so, the rite is renewed afresh for our generation. The new king will have his say, the Archbishop of Canterbury his; other officials will add their own two penn'orth. Of course the media will want a say too. Out of it all will arise a ceremony that will be unique to our king and our generation.

St Paul, writing to the Roman Church, reminds us that all earthly authorities - yes even the bad ones (this is more tricky to explain and may require an entire theological tome to be written) - have been established by God. Here's how he put it: "Let everyone be subject to the governing authorities, for there is no authority except that which God has established. The authorities that exist have been established by God. Consequently, whoever rebels against the authority is rebelling against what God has instituted, and those who do so will bring judgment on themselves." Romans 13.1-2

When the Israelites settled in the promised land, they asked Samuel the prophet to appoint a king to rule over them. This request was distressing to Samuel, because in asking for a king, they were rejecting God as their King: "But when they said, 'Give us a king to lead us,' this displeased Samuel; so he prayed to the Lord. And the Lord told him: 'Listen to all that the people are saying to you; it is not you they have rejected, but they have rejected me as their king." 1 Samuel 8.6-7

So, King Charles III will be crowned king on 6th May, but let us not, in celebrating with him, reject the Lord our God as King of Kings and Lord of Lords. Let us follow the advice of Jesus and render therefore to Caesar the things that are Caesar's, and to God the things that are God's."



A Trip to the Netherlands

We recently took a train trip to the Netherlands. Our hotel was based in Delft, famous for its blue pottery. Delft was a miniature version of Amsterdam with its canals through the streets, beautiful squares and crazy Dutch people on bikes!



This picture depicts the Christian scene we are all very familiar with. The photo was taken in the museum at the only remaining working Delft pottery. All the tiles were handmade, painted and fired and then fitted together to create the scene. A truly amazing piece of work.

Of course, what are the Netherlands famous for but the tulips! This photograph was taken at the famous Keukenhof Gardens. Unfortunately, the weather was not very kind so the large outside displays of tulips were not in bloom. However, the picture



does show a smaller pot full of God's creation brimming with colour and beauty for our appreciation.



Delft has two main churches, both fascinating with a history to be told. The NIEUWE KERK (new church) holds the mausoleum of William of Orange which is a grand monument and also a copy of the Statenbijei which is the first Bible translation from the original Hebrew and Greek languages into the Dutch language.

The first complete Dutch Bible was printed in Antwerp in 1526 by Jacob van Liesvelt. This translation and other existing Dutch Bibles were merely translations of other

translations. In 1618-19 it was deemed necessary to have a new translation, accurately based on the original languages in imitation of the King James Bible from 1611.

In 1626 the States-General accepted the request from the Synod and the translation started. It was completed in 1635 and authorized by the States-General in 1637. From then until 1657 half a million copies were printed and this translation remained authoritative in Protestant churches well into the 20th century.
